A. <u>August 21, 2019</u>	Trustee Evaristo motioned, and it was seconded by Trustee Dr. Um, to approve the August 21, 2019 minutes as printed. The motion carried with all ayes.	All Board members	None	Approved
III. OLD BUSINESS				
A. <u>Biannual Review of Board of Trustees Bylaws</u>	Trustee Siliang informed the Board that the Governance, Bylaws, and Strategic Planning (GBSP) subcommittee did not convene prior to this meeting; however, the review of the duties and responsibilities for each subcommittee was in process. All recommendations received will be presented to the GBSP subcommittee for review and consideration at the next scheduled meeting. Once a final draft of the Bylaws is available, it will be submitted to the Board of Trustees for final review and approval. IV. NEW BUSINESS				
A. Tax Withholdings from Prior Years owed to DRT	<p>Ms. Perez-Posadas informed the Board that the withholding taxes from prior years were for three quarters in fiscal years 2014, 2015, 2017 and for all quarters in 2018. Withholding taxes were paid in full in 2016 using proceeds from a bond acquired that year.</p> <p>She stated that the hospital began making payments for 2018, with the most recent in the amount of \$299K for a January 2018 invoice. The hospital will continue making payments for 2018 and will address all prior year obligations thereafter.</p> <p>Ms. Perez-Posadas informed the Board that payments for 2019 have been made since January 2019 and were current. She added that weekly 'Executive Huddles' were held as a constant follow-up to this issue, among other pressing matters that needed to be addressed.</p> <p>In total, the hospital had an outstanding balance of \$8.7M including interest and penalties. However, a letter was submitted to the Department of Revenue and Taxation (DRT) requesting for a waiver of those fees assessed. A second letter will be submitted to the DRT to provide further justification regarding the hospital's hardship as recommended by Director Daphne Shimizu, according to Ms. Perez-Posadas.</p> <p>Trustee Dr. Um inquired how this occurred and he was informed by Ms. Perez-Posadas that the hospital had struggled financially in the past, therefore, the tax withholdings were just not paid.</p> <p>Ms. Perez-Posadas informed the Board that this matter had been mentioned in at least two prior meetings and apologized for not emphasizing the seriousness of the matter. She stated that reason behind her not pushing the issue was because the hospital looked forward to</p>	Hospital Administrator/C EO	None	Informational

	<p>possibly off-setting its debt to DRT with debt owed to GMHA for clinic services provided at the Department of Corrections (DOC), as was done in the past.</p> <p>The DOC owed the hospital approximately \$2M for fiscal year 2018 and \$284K per month for June, July and August 2019 for clinic services. She stated that those amounts did not include the approximately \$5-6M owed for inpatient services provided to inmates.</p> <p>Ms. Perez-Posadas informed the Board that, as a result of a law that prohibited the Department of Corrections from paying prior years obligations, the DRT served the hospital with Notices of Intent to Levy and Right to Hearing.</p> <p>The following initiatives are/will be taken to address the matter moving forward:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • legislative appropriations will be sought to fund payments for the outstanding tax withholdings from prior years; • funding from the remaining balance of the FY-2019 pharmaceutical funding allotment (\$8.2M of \$30M) will be used to pay tax withholdings from prior years; • the hospital was looking at ways to decrease expenditures and increase revenues starting with on-call and overtime pay. <p><u>Other discussions:</u> Trustee Evaristo was informed that the second Town Hall meeting was postponed and would be rescheduled.</p> <p>Dr. Aguon mentioned that although the Town Hall meeting was postponed, changes to on-call and overtime pay had been implemented. She noted that a review of overtime and on-call pay in September 2019 already showed a decrease in those expenses.</p> <p>Absent a Town Hall meeting, Dr. Bordallo mentioned that meetings were held with the affected departments before changes to on-call and overtime pay were implemented.</p>







Will ISIS end with leader's death?

AL HOL, Syria — "Our emir is not dead!" shouted a bespectacled Egyptian woman from behind a chain-link fence. "This is propaganda! We don't believe it!"

"More American lies," said another woman, who spoke with a French accent but would not say what country she was from.

The women, who wore black veils and cloaks from head to toe and would not give their names, are among 70,000 detainees at a camp in northeastern Syria — all relatives of Islamic State fighters who were dead or in jail.

They bridled at the notion that Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, the leader of Islamic State, had been killed Saturday in northwestern Syria in a U.S. raid — a reported development that was celebrated in Washington, Europe and much of the Middle East and raises existential questions about the group's future.

Sheep grazed outside the fencing encircling the sun-baked detention camp, which is guarded by Kurdish troops, who often exchange taunts with their charges.

The camp administration, fearing further unrest in an already unstable environment, shut down the internet at the camp Sunday as news began to spread of al-Baghdadi's demise. Officials also restricted access to journalists, explaining that the situation at the camp was more volatile than usual.

"We don't want the people to be any more agitated," said Elol Rizgar, a Kurdish fighter and one of the camp administrators. "We want to maintain

calm as much as possible."

Children playing outside canvas tents with blue United Nations lettering greet visitors with a raised index finger — an Islamic State gesture threatening death.

Few doubt that the reported death of al-Baghdadi is a devastating symbolic blow to Islamic State.

He loomed smaller in the American psyche than Osama bin Laden, the architect of the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks. But it was under his reign that an exhausted insurgency in Iraq metastasized into the world's most notorious terrorist group.

"This is a man who built a whole, as he would like to call it, 'a country,' a caliphate, and was trying to do it again," President Donald Trump told reporters Sunday.

A plump-faced religious scholar from Iraq, Baghdadi was detained during the U.S. invasion there in 2003 and held at a U.S.-run detention center for 11 months before being released.

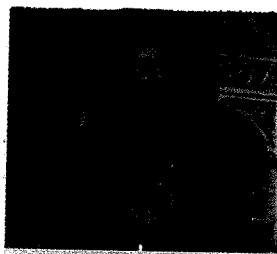
Few in the world had heard of him — fewer still had ever seen him — when al-Baghdadi plodded up to the pulpit of the Great Nuri Mosque in 2014, in the Iraqi city of Mosul, and declared himself the "emir," or head, of the faithful.

His reign was marked with bouts of genocidal reengineering of communities that didn't fit his vision for a Sunni Muslim state.

Islamic State conducted a systematic erasure of the Yazidi people, massacring the men, placing the women in sexual slavery and indoctrinating the children to be future extremists.

Elsewhere, the group's fighters launched attacks so ferocious that enemies shed their uniforms and ran away.

Millions suffered under al-Baghdadi's blood-drenched rule. At its zenith,

his caliphate extended across a third of both Iraq and Syria, with tens of thousands of fighters from dozens of countries.

In the meantime, the group entrenched itself in the running of state affairs, cajoling or threatening those working in public institutions to yield to its cause. It also constructed a network of informers and enforcers.

Rival campaigns, one by the U.S.-led coalition, another led by Russia, began to take back territory from the caliphate in 2015 and by this year the group had lost nearly all of it and reverted to its old strategy of launching terrorist attacks.

U.S. and Iraqi military officials have described the group's remnants as little more than a criminal gang, reduced to conducting gadfly attacks in sparsely populated areas where its fighters can easily hide.

Even after Islamic State began to suffer defeats, the elusiveness of al-Baghdadi helped give the group an aura of invincibility.

The United States placed a \$25 million bounty on his head, turning him

into one of the world's most wanted men.

Every year would bring fresh boasts that he had been killed or incapacitated. Sensational news reports would speak of near-misses, with rumors of a black-clad sheik departing from an area just before it was bombed or overrun.

Al-Baghdadi would always show up again, commenting on regional developments in audio and video messages, while urging his adherents to keep attacking what he called the "Crusaders" and their "lackeys."

Though many Muslims rejected his labeling himself a caliph, among his followers he gained a special position, said Hisham Hashimi, an Iraqi researcher of extremist groups.

What has never been clear, however, is what practical role he held in Islamic State's commanding structure — a mystery at the heart of what now happens to Islamic State.

In one scenario, al-Baghdadi had become the group's play master, so essential that it will not be able to function without him.

But there is another scenario in which al-Baghdadi matters far less. ISIS expert Aymenn Jawad Tamimi said that Islamic State defectors have described al-Baghdadi as a distant figure, often difficult to contact and slow to respond to advice or consultations.

In this version of the future, his ideology lives on, inspiring terrorists around the world to continue his project.

Proponents of this view point to Islamic State's return to its guerrilla roots, which has made the group's leadership only more diffuse.

"Daesh's authority is a horizontal hierarchy much more than a vertical one," Hashimi said, referring to the group by its Arabic acronym. "It won't end even with the death of all of its leaders."


