- The \$7.7M CARES Act Provider Relief Funds via UHHS received in prior year is now depleted.
- GMH received another \$2M CARES Act Provider Relief Funds from UHHS in December 2020.
- Since October 2020, GMH received \$3.9M from GovGuam's Cares Act Funds.
- Lower collection of patients' receivable by \$4M when compared to prior year's average collection rate.
- Cash used for operations averaged \$14.1M per month for the first quarter of FY 2021, compared to an average of \$12M per month in FY 2020. This is mainly due to NuWest traveling nurses (\$3.9M paid to date) and purchase of Remdesivir drug (\$1.2M paid to date), which GMH started paying in October 2020.

With reduced cash starting October 2020, vendor payables had increased. Top five vendors, which account for \$5.4M (or 49%) of total trade payables, are: (a) AETNA for employees' insurance premiums; (b) MD Wholesale, ASD Specialty Healthcare (for Remdesivir), and JMI-Edison for pharmaceutical and general supplies; and (c) NuWest for traveling nurses.

• In June 2020, bad debts rate for self-pays was increased to 80% from 59%, thereby decreasing **net** patient revenues. Three months of net revenue is under budget by \$3.6M. In addition, **gross** patient revenue was lower by \$4.4M compared to prior year. This appears to be the effect of limiting outpatient services.

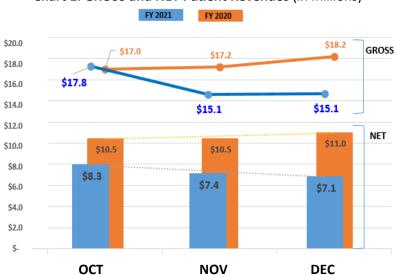


Chart 1. GROSS and NET Patient Revenues (in millions)

- Medicaid matching was increased to 100% in 1st quarter of FY 2020 but not in FY 2021.
- More than half of collections from third-parties (53% or \$4.4M) for three months ended 12/31/20 was from AETNA. Meanwhile, GMH collected \$180K in December 2020 from TakeCare.
- DRT garnishments from self-pays totaled \$1.8M for three months ended 12/31/20. This was more than double the prior year of the same period.

- Personnel costs grew by \$3.1M. On average, headcount was higher by 101 compared to prior year. Current year personnel cost includes \$1.9M in COVID-19 employees' differential pays.
- Current year contractual services include \$4.5M from NuWest nurses and \$1.2M in COVID-19 contract physicians' pay.
- Supplies and materials increased by \$2.4M mainly due to issuances of Remdesivir drug to COVID-19 patients and scrub suits used as personal protective equipment.
