"RELATIVE TO CREATING FOUR (4) NEW TELEMEDICINE TECHNICIAN POSITIONS AND AMENDING THE TOTAL POSITION FTE COUNT ON THE GMHA STAFFING PATTERN"

WHEREAS, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) has experienced and continues to experience department staffing shortages hospital-wide; and

WHEREAS, on February 8, 2022, the Clinical Nurse Informatics Supervisor met with the Human Resources Department to request guidance in hiring four (4) Telemedicine Technicians as the GMHA expands telehealth physician services that should assist in lowering healthcare costs, entrance service efficiencies, and provide patients and their families better access to healthcare services; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the GMHA FY 2022 budget was held at the Guam Legislature on May 20, 2021; and the FY 2022 budget was submitted to the Office of Finance and Budget on March 30, 2021 as approved by the GMHA Board of Trustees on March 24, 2021 and is posted on the GMHA website; and

WHEREAS, Position No. F017 is vacant and has the funding availability to convert to four (4) Telemedicine Technician positions; and

WHEREAS, this amendment to the staffing pattern affects only the total number of FTE positions from 1239 to 1243 which has no impact to the approved budgeted amount and will be submitted to the Office of Finance and Budget and 36th Guam Legislature as an approved amendment; and be it



US judges faced over 4,500 threats in 2021 amid rising extremism

WASHINGTON - U.S. federal judges were the target of more than 4,500 threats and other inappropriate communications last year, the head of the U.S. Marshals Service said Monday, adding that his office is concerned about the rise of domestic extremism in America.

"The increase in our judicial ... threat investigations and inappropriate comments have been going up quite frankly for a couple of years," Ronald Davis, director of the U.S. Marshals Service, told journalists in a conference call. He said the threat risk is "growing exponentially."

Federal law enforcement officials have sounded alarm bells about a growing tide of threats posed by white supremacists and anti-government activists, many of whom have touted former Republican President Donald Trump's false claims that the 2020 election was stolen.

Earlier this year, Attorney General Merrick Garland launched a task force aimed at combating threats targeting state election workers and volunteers. an effort that so far has led to two criminal cases.

Garland has also instructed the FBI to work with local officials to monitor an increase in threats to school boards, which have faced an onslaught of criticism over issues ranging from mask

mandates to the teaching of critical race theory.

The threats to judges were varied and in some cases came from disgruntled defendants, Davis said.

In one example, a self-described anti-feminist attorney in 2020 shot and killed the son of federal judge Esther Sala at her home in New Jersey. In the attack, Roy Den Hollander also wounded Sala's husband. Hollander was later found dead in an apparent suicide at his home.

The U.S. Marshals Service is tasked with protecting courts across the country's 94 federal district courts, in addition to transporting prisoners and helping to locate fugitives.

Filing: Longtime Trump accounting firm cuts ties, cannot stand behind statements

NEW YORK (Reuters) - The accounting firm that handled Donald Trump's company's financial statements dropped it as a client and said it could no longer stand behind a decade of statements, a court filing showed Monday.

Mazars USA, in a Feb. 9 letter made public Monday, told the Trump Organization, the former president's New York-based real estate business, that its financial statements for 2011 through 2020 should no longer be relied on.

of New York Attorney General Letitia James' civil investigation into the Trump Organization, which could result in financial penalties. That probe partially overlaps a criminal investigation by the Manhattan District Attorney, which James joined in May, into the company's practices.

Mazars said it had based its conclusion on a January filing by the New York attorney general, its own investigation and information from internal and external sources.

"While we have not concluded that the various financial statements, as a whole, contain material discrepancies, based upon the totality of the circumstances we believe our advice to you to no longer rely upon those financial statements is appropriate," Mazars said in the letter addressed to the chief legal officer at the Trump Organization, Alan Garten.

In the letter, filed in New York state court, Mazars said that it had "performed its work in accordance with professional standards."

The accounting firm also said it would no longer work for the Trump Organization.

New York state's attorney general has accused the Trump Organization of repeatedly misrepresenting the value of its assets to obtain financial benefits.

one another of fomenting war in eastern Ukraine on Saturday as Western leaders lined up at a security conference in Munich to pledge resistance to alleged Russian plans to march into Ukraine.

Insurgents in Ukraine's Donetsk region said several dozen shells had been fired at their territory, while the Ukrainian army listed some 19 ceasefire violations. Neither side's claim could be independently verified.

The head of the separatists in the eastern Ukrainian region of Donetsk, Denis Pushilin, called for a "general mobilization" of reservists after signing a decree to this effect, he wrote on a Telegram news channel.

"I appeal to all the men of the republic who are able to hold a weapon in their hands to stand up for their families, their children, their wives, their mothers," he wrote on Saturday morning.

A similar appeal was made in the neighboring Luhansk region, also controlled by separatists. Men aged 18 to 55 were reportedly no longer able to leave the area.

One Ukrainian government soldier was killed in the fresh skirmishes, the Ukrainian military posted on Face-

book, while the Donbass insurgents announced that one civilian has been injured.

The region has been the site of standoff that started in 2014 when Russianbacked separatists carved out a region of control in eastern Ukraine - as well as annexing the Crimean Peninsula in retaliation after a Ukrainian protest movement drove out a Russian-backed government and the country sought closer ties to the West.

But the situation has worsened in recent months amid allegations that Russian troops are prepared to march on Ukraine. Russia denies the charges, despite massing troops at Ukraine's border. It has in recent days argued that the troops have been pulled back, but NATO says it has seen no proof of that.

The Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe has noted a significant increase in violations of a cease-fire between Ukrainian and separatist forces in recent weeks. Moscow and Kyiv have been blaming each other for spiraling tensions.

Evacuations of towns and villages in the Luhansk and Donetsk regions continued. According to the Donetsk separatists early on Saturday, more than 6,000 people have already been brought to safety, including 2,400 children.

The Ukrainian military has stressed that no offensive is planned.

Western powers have warned that Moscow could be planning an invasion, and in recent days have said Russia could be planning a false-flag opera-

tion to establish a pretext for a military incursion.

Despite the situation, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy traveled to the Munich Security Conference on Saturday, where many leaders took to the stage to warn Russia against any attack and to plead for continued diplomacy.

The U.S. has repeatedly warned that the danger levels are rising, U.S. Vice President Kamala Harris was one of those in Munich and used her speech there to warn Russia it should be prepared for a unified Western backlash should it go through with a feared attack.

"Today the U.S. and our allies and our partners are closer together. Today, we are clear in our purpose. And today we are even more confident in our vision," she said.

But there was no Russian partner to hear her message, since Russia opted to sit out the conference this year.

Zelenskyy told the conference that the world had failed Ukraine by having a security architecture that he described as "beyond repair."

"The security architecture of Europe is almost destroyed. It's too late to talk about fixing it," he said during a speech at the Munich Security Conference.

He slammed other countries for not providing his country with the military assistance it needs in light of the Russian threat.

Zelenskyy was forthright in voicing his frustrations over the lack of action from the international community since the crisis began.

"You're saying the war is about to
